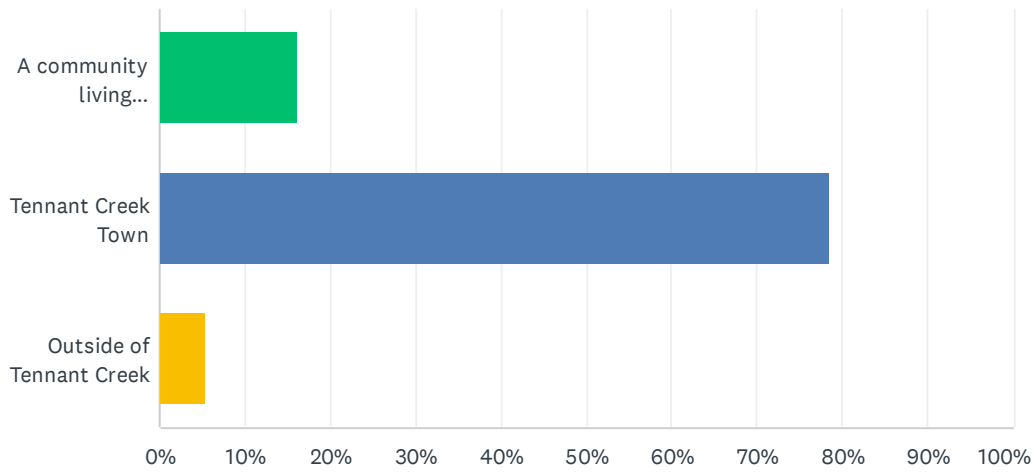


Q1 Where do you usually live?

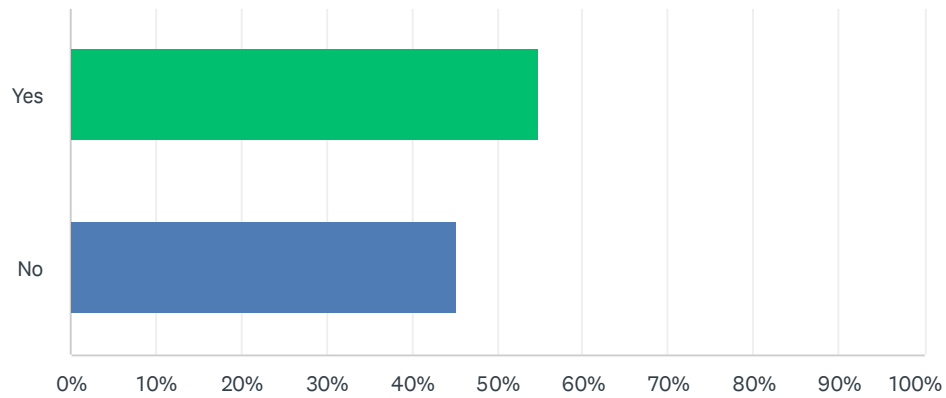

Q2 Do you identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander

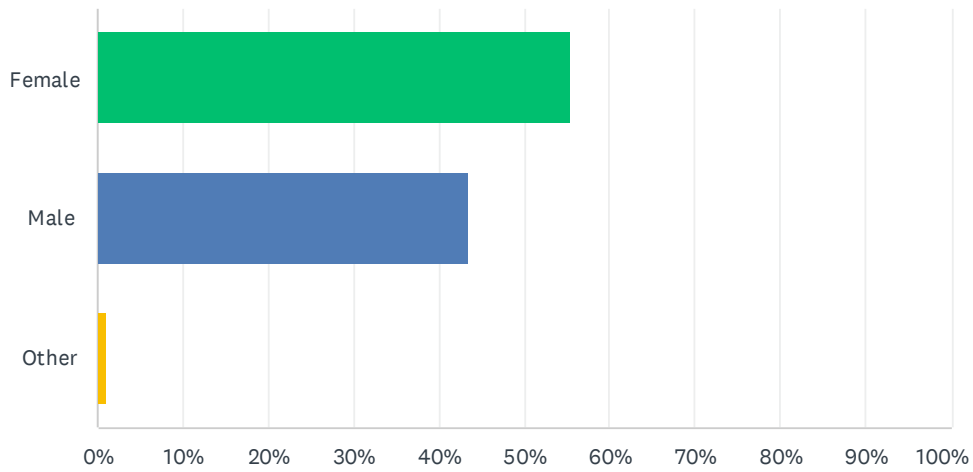

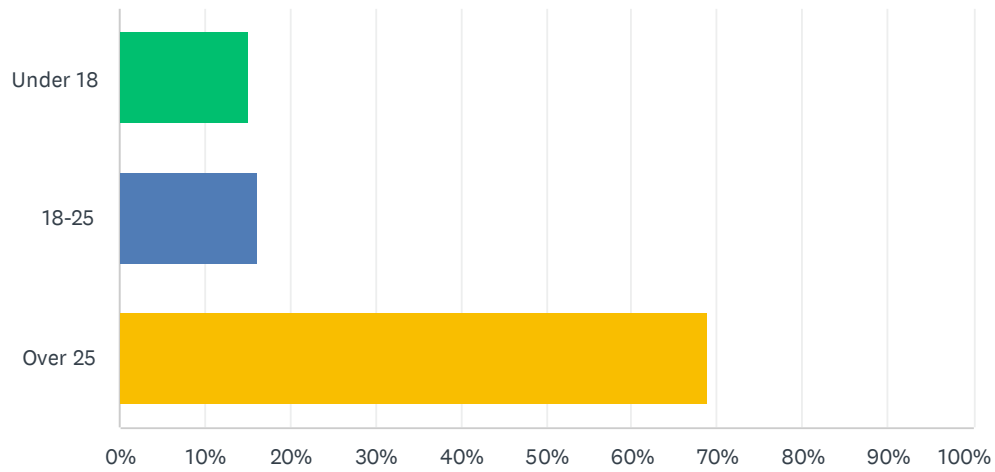

Q4 What age group are you?

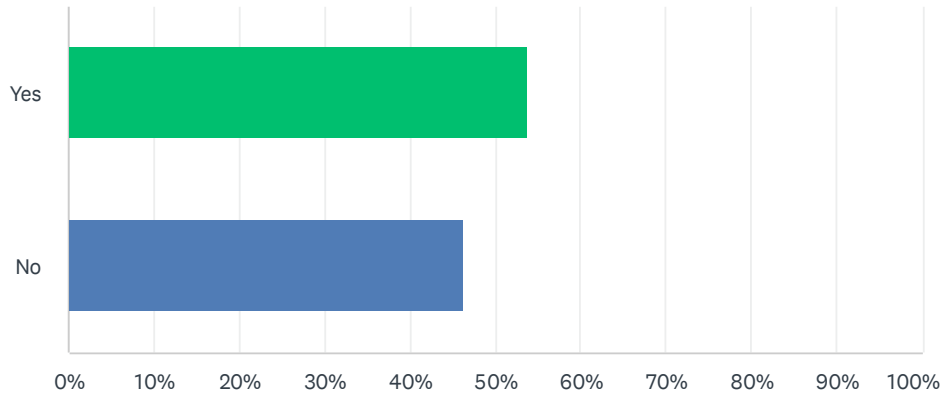

Q5 Do you work for a service provider or agency that is involved with youth in Tennant Creek?

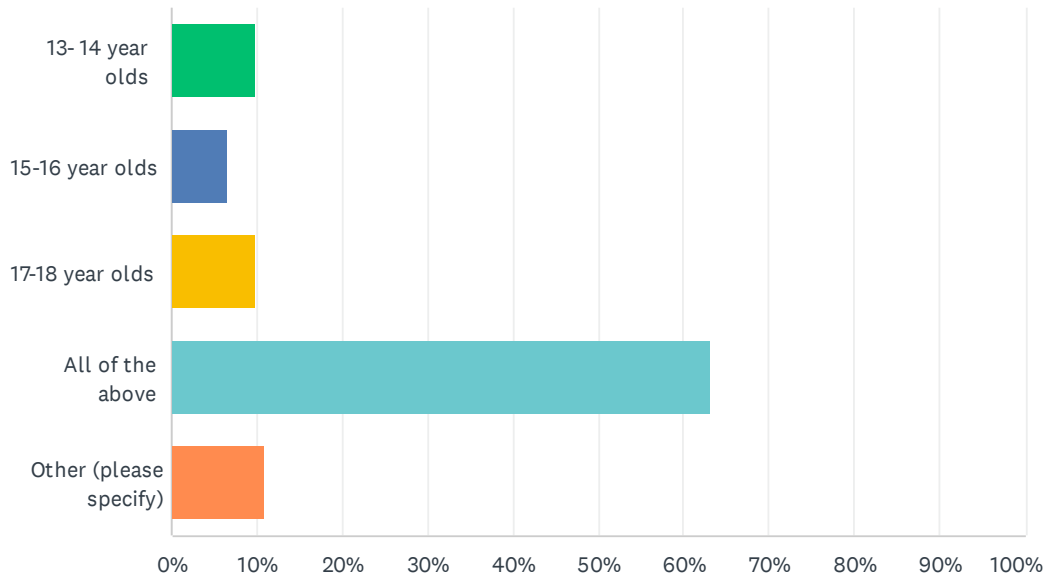
